NOMINATION GUIDELINES FOR THE
CHAPEL OF FOUR CHAPLAINS

The Chapel of Four Chaplains program is held in memory of, and commemorating the selfless spirit of the four chaplains that perished aboard the USAT Dorchester.

The Marine Corps League and Auxiliary support the Chapel and its programs by nominating deserving persons for the “LEGION OF HONOR” award. The qualifications for this award are that the individual has been performing some selfless service in their community, or toward another individual, without thought of compensation or reward. The selfless service must go beyond what the individual does for a living. There are thousands of such people in every community, and this program gives us an opportunity to recognize their efforts.

1. Nominations for the “LEGION OF HONOR” award are made with a short statement of the selfless service, made on a simple standard form, and submitted to the Chapel.
2. The nominee may, but not need be, a member of the League or Auxiliary.
3. The nominator must be a person who is a previous recipient of the award.
4. The award is presented at some appropriate venue such as a special ceremony, convention, or meeting, at which the awardee may be recognized. Where and when you would like the award presented should be noted on the nomination form.
5. Note that nominees are contacted by mail, prior to the scheduled ceremony, confirming their willingness to accept the award. Leave enough time for the mail (about six weeks).

Nomination forms are available on the MCLA National Auxiliary Web Page, the June newsletter, or through National Headquarters. This program is a wonderful way to recognize members and persons from your community, and bring the Auxiliary to the attention of the public.
